- The group uses intimidation tactics (Wall Street Journal 8/11/05)
- Lead a near riot during two meetings of the Michigan Board of Canvassers in December of last year, and a clear threat from BAMN leader Luke Massie to do so again this year. (Detroit Free Press 7/25/05, MIRS July 19-22, 2005 Michigan Daily 1/6/06)
- Even many liberal groups have denounced BAMN for their extreme tactics

- When the leadership of BAMN has been rejected by the larger coalition of proracial preference groups "Mr. Massie (the leader of BAMN) called the assertion that the two groups are unrelated 'not entirely true.' He declined to elaborate." (New York Sun 11/22/05)
- Citizens for a United Michigan have never uniformly rejected all the actions of By Any Means Necessary including: interrupting State Board of Canvassers meetings, screaming and spitting on supporters of Michigan Civil Rights supporters. .
